## St. Francis Vestry

#### Approved Vestry Minutes March 2024



Present: John Parisee, Jerry Groshart, Ruth Lindstedt, Ron Lien, Wood Palmer, Bishop Jos Tharakan attended via Zoom, Dan Baxter attended as Treasurer. Darrell Reinke attended as a guest via Zoom.

The meeting was recorded on Zoom, the minutes were written from the recording.

The February vestry minutes were approved via email by John, Ron, Ruth, Jerry, & Wood.

Darrel gave the opening prayer.

#### Treasurer -

Dan Baxter reviewed the Transaction Detail by Account for February. Ron made a motion to accept the expenditures and Jerry seconded the motion. All in favor, motion carried.

Dan said that he and John will go to the bank to invest in short-term CD's.

John asked for a volunteer from vestry to be an additional signer to our checking accounts. Ruth Lindstedt volunteered. John made a motion to accept Ruth Lindstedt as the additional signer on our checking accounts, Ron seconded the motion. All in favor, motion carried. John will meet Ruth at Key Bank after 11 on Friday.

#### Senior Warden

Musician Bonuses – After a lengthy discussion the vestry decided to give our musicians a 10% increase to their pay per service. Jerry made a motion to pay the musicians an additional 10% per service effective immediately and Ruth seconded the motion. Ron recused himself from the vote. All in favor (except for Ron), motion carried.

Congregational Development – John had asked that the members read the first two chapters of Autopsy of a Deceased Church. A discussion took place, and some great comments were made regarding members' thoughts on areas where we are strong and areas that we can improve.

Bishop Jos spoke about spiritual renewal, he felt that we need to be strong in that before money is spent on evangelizing.

Erosion of the church and how we can avoid it further was discussed.

Comments were made on the great leadership that we currently have in place.

Members felt that our strength is in our committees.

Darrell said he would like include the Worship Committee in on the conversation regarding the book.

John gave an update on Holy Week services and the prayer vigil.

Ruth will facilitate another retreat on April 13<sup>th</sup> called "The Care of Creation".

John announced that the Urban family, who own Property Management, would like to swap the bill for snow plowing this year in exchange for allowing his family to hold a memorial service for their mother. The members felt that they should get a bill for the snowplowing that is equal to the rental of the church, so we have a paper trail.

#### Junior Warden

Ron reported that the snowblower needs to be fixed, he will take it to Ace.

Ron still needs to replace a light fixture in the basement. It was decided that we will replace it when we remodel the sleeping room.

Wood reported that the handicapped chair is not working properly. We need to alert Building & Grounds so we can have a service person come out and look at it.

A volunteer shoveled the snow that was blocking the back door and pathway.

#### Committees

Worship - Ruth gave a verbal report on the Worship Committee. The committee was provided with minutes from the last meeting.

Pastoral Care – The committee was provided with minutes from the last meeting.

Outreach - John gave a verbal report on Outreach.

Building & Grounds – John said that he had some contractors that were interested in finishing the front entry, he will try to meet with them on Friday.

Finance – John praised Dan Baxter and Dick Gooding and their contributions to this committee.

Endowment – John noted that Dick Gooding was a great asset to this committee.

Christian Education – John said he would like to re-establish this committee; it currently does not have any members. John would like to ask Eric to head up the committee, all agreed.

John thanked Darrell for his time at the meeting.

Meeting adjourned.

The next meeting is scheduled for April 9<sup>th</sup>.
